Brookside pays Ksh100 million bonus in industry first

airy farmers contracted to Brookside Dairy are smiling all the way to the bank after the processor paid out Ksh100 million in cash bonuses under a reward scheme. The farmers, numbering more than 300 from 25 counties, signed up into the bonus scheme, in which they were given raw milk supply targets. On Wednesday, Brookside honoured the farmers, further cementing its excellent relationship with

raw milk suppliers across the country. Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Irrigation Cabinet Secretary Mwangi Kiunjuri presided over the award ceremony at Brookside Dairy's Ruiru processing hub, flanked by the firm's executive chairman, Muhoho Kenyatta.

"The government will support all initiatives that seek to motivate farmers to grow volumes of milk. However, there is a need to address challenges that prevent us from optimising the value of the dairy enterprise, such over-reliance on rain-fed agriculture," Mr Kiunjuri said.


